Brief history

The Campus of Forestry in Nikkarila Pieksämäki, founded in 1905, is one of Finland's oldest forestry education institutions. Nikkarila offers a polytechnic level forestry engineer course and adult education. In basic education we offer two options: Forestry and Forest Product Marketing. In adult education we concentrate on forestry based business, management, communications, media and other customer designed programs. The campus is located between three beautiful lakes 4 km from Pieksämäki. The surrounding forests are owned by the school.

Living in Nikkarila, Pieksämäki

The spirit of Nikkarila is one of a kind. In a small community, about 150 - 200 students altogether, the students and the teachers are one big family. The School has a long and good reputation in Finnish forestry. Most of the students live on the school campus only a few hundred metres from the main building. Nikkarila and its surroundings offer very good possibilities for nature oriented hobbies.

General information about Pieksämäki

Characteristic of the landscape of Pieksämäki are the high moraine hills, which were settled in the 13th and 14th centuries. Pieksämäki was established between 1573 and 1575. Nowadays Pieksämäki is the heart of Central-Savo. The Savo railway, which was built in 1889, gave the region a new look. The East - West railway was brought into use in 1918. The new railways and their junction shaped the town.

Pieksämäki is a well planned small town and regional centre. The town plan includes a variety of elements: squares, parks and boulevards. The railways, trade and services play the principal roles in the economic life of Pieksämäki. The metal and printing industries are the main employers.

In Pieksämäki you don't have to go far to see and experience the wonders of nature. The climate and the deep forests in this watershed region are clearly boreal. You can find many northern species, like swans, in Pieksämäki region. Lake Pieksänjärvi reaches into the centre of the town. You can take long walks along the shoreline of various lakes around Pieksämäki. Also the forests and the peat lands of the area are worth getting to know.

How to arrive at Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences, Nikkarila Campus

Please find this information how to arrive at our institute Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences/Pieksämäki Campus of forestry. After arrival to Helsinki from airport of Vantaa it is more economic for you to take FINNAIR buses, which are leaving quite near to airport to the center of the Helsinki. The bus stops quite near to the railway station (under 100 m) and so you are in the railway station. There you can ask from taxi to get Eurohostel if you need economic accommodation in Helsinki. You choose the train leaving towards north. It is better to buy two way ticket from Helsinki to Pieksämäki (you must leave the train at Pieksämäki, it will be your "home town"). Don't leave the train in Mikkeli (although the name is our University of Applied Sciences is called University of Applied Sciences of Mikkeli. The Campus of Forestry is located in the town of Pieksämäki (75 kms still north from Mikkeli)

Adult Education (Finnish)

Adult education is implemented as continuous education in the field of forestry. The adult education consist basically three different kinds of programs:

1. Degree oriented for those of previous knowledge and working life history. We have implemented during the last years programs leading to the bachelor degree (focus on marketing management in forest or legal issues in forestry) and the master degree)Business Operations in Forestry).
2. Specialization studies: long lasting programs according to the needs of working life e.g. legal issues in forestry, forest road construction and forest ditching specialist.
3. Short programs or courses designed according to the needs of working life, e.g. organization development, strategies, welfare if work.

3. INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES AT THE CAMPUS OF FORESTRY

STUDENT EXCHANGE IN MIKKELI UNIVERSITY OF APPLIED SCIENCES

Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences is one of the most international University of Applied Sciences' in Finland. Due to the extensive network of partner institutions all over the world Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences students have the opportunity to spend a semester or a whole academic year studying abroad. Exchange period abroad is an excellent way to improve your language skills, gain more experiences in life and make new friends.

In addition to these facts, after your studies abroad you will be more mature and capable of facing the challenges of the more and more international working life. Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences has over 200 partner institutions all over the world. Every year, approximately 230 of our students spend a study period abroad. The most popular destinations have been Great Britain, the Netherlands, Germany and Sweden. There are, however, students leaving for more distant continents as well, i.e. North and South America, South-East Asia and Australia. Depending on the destination and the eligibility to the respective exchange program, the students have the opportunity to get a grant for their studies abroad.

Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences' reputation as an international institution of higher education has grown during the recent years. We receive yearly approximately 90 foreign students during our autumn and spring semesters. The English language International Summer Term has turned out to be particularly popular among the students and teachers of our partner institutions - every summer, more than 100 foreign students come to study at Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences.



Enrolment procedure

Mikkeli UAS uses an [Online Application System](#) for incoming exchange students. Please, fill in the requested information and submit the application form to us. The application period for the autumn term and the whole academic year is 1 April - 15 May, 2011. Courses for the academic year 2011 - 2012 are available. Please note, that minor changes are possible.

Host country formalities

Please contact your nearest Finnish Embassy or Consulate to find information about the documents required when studying in Finland. The documents may include the following according to which country (EU-, Non-EU, Nordic Country) you are coming from:

- Passport or ID-card
- Visa documentation (non-EU and non-Nordic citizens)
- Non-EU and non-Nordic citizens: Health Inspection document by authorized doctor
- EU-citizens: International Health Insurance papers (e.g. E111- and E128 -forms)
- Travel insurance policy
- Certificate of vaccination (diphtheria and tetanus)

a) Residence permit: Citizens of EU/EEA and Nordic countries

EU and Nordic citizens who will be staying in Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences **for more than three months** will need to apply for a residence permit at the Pieksämäki police station. The following documents are necessary:

- 1) Passport;
- 2) Two passport photos;
- 3) Letter of acceptance from Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences;
- 4) Certificate of funding, i.e. proof that you have enough money to support yourself (e.g. certificate of your Erasmus/Nordplus status and the amount of your grant) - this should be obtained at your home institution;
- 5) Proof of health insurance (e.g. form E-111/E-128 from your home country). Please note that the travel insurance is not enough!
- 6) They charge of this 40 euros

b) Residence permit: Citizens of other countries

Students from non-EU/EEA and non-Nordic countries, in general, need to obtain a residence permit through the Finnish embassy or legation in their home country before arrival in Finland. The residence permit will be valid for one academic year at a time; the permit then needs to be extended by the local police authorities. Contact the Finnish embassy or legation in your home country for further details.

c) Accommodation

The Campus of Forestry will help you in finding the accommodation and the exchange students usually live in the apartments near to the Nikkarila Campus area. This is located quite near to the campus. You will share your room with other Finnish or foreign student according to the agreement. The accommodation is equipped with WLAN.

The price of accommodation is about 76 EUR /per./month (2 persons/room). The price includes water, heating, electricity and basic furniture (bed, table, chairs). The price does not include cleaning or meals. After your arrival at the Campus of Forestry you will sign the housing contract in the Campus office.



d) Health services and insurance

All students are entitled to use the services of the school nurse free of charge. You can also use the services offered by Pieksämäki Health Care Centre. Private services are much more expensive unless you have a valid travel insurance which covers these.

Your national health care insurance is also valid in Finland if you come from the EU or EEA countries. Please check your social insurance in your own country. You also need an E-111/E-128 form from your local health authority to bring with you to Finland. Before you leave, remember to check up your insurances. We recommend you to obtain insurance covering free time and travel and health care.

With European Health Care Insurance Card the fee varies between 12.80 € and 25.60 €. Without European Health Care Insurance Card the payment is from 80 € to 100 €. Sometimes it is cheaper to go to the private doctor.

Computers

The computers in computer classes are at your disposal on school days between 8 a.m. - 9 p.m. whenever there are no lessons going on. Furthermore, there are computers in the library for students' use. The computers are equipped with the Microsoft Office package and some special programs. There is also access to Internet. WLAN is at your disposal in the whole campus.

IMPORTANT! In the main building the alarm system is on weekdays between 21.00 - 06.00 and on weekends always. It is so no permitted to be in during those times.

Student association

The students' association in Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences is called MAMOK, Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences Student Union. Its principal function is to attend to students' interests by influencing decision-making in the administration of Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences and city councils. Furthermore, the state administration is influenced through the national umbrella organisation SAMOK. The members of the student association get many benefits, for example, in travelling, telephone and insurance services.

Other practical information

Shops

Grocery shops and department stores in Pieksämäki (and in Finland in general) are usually open between 9.00-20.00 on weekdays and between 9.00-18.00 on Saturdays, on Sundays the shops are normally closed with the exception of some small grocery shops). There may also be some extended opening hours on Fridays until 21.00 and some grocery shops already open their doors at 8.00 or even at 7.00 on weekdays.

Banks

Banks in Pieksämäki (and in Finland in general) are open 9.30-16.15 on weekdays (Mo-Fri), at weekends the banks are closed.

If you are staying in Mikkeli for a longer period, you might consider the possibility of opening a bank account. There are several banks at the Pieksämäki centre such as: Nordea ,Osuuspankki and Sampo pankki

1. Reserve an appointment at the bank for opening an account beforehand! Banks in Finland tend to have long lines for walk-in service.
2. Take your passport, study certificate from Mikkeli University of Applied Sciences and declaration form (available at the International Office) filled in beforehand with you.
3. The services offered by the bank include disposal account, balance report once a month, ATM-card or Visa-electron card, Solo codes.

There is money exchange available at any bank in Finland but it's wise to change bigger amounts at one time to avoid paying high service charges. It is also possible to withdraw money from a foreign bank account by using an ATM-card from your account at home. The international services which ATM-machines support in Finland include: Visa, Visa Electron, Euro Master Card, Maestro, Plus, Cirrus, EC and Solo. Most major international credit cards including VISA, Master Card and American Express are widely accepted in Finland.

Postal services

The main post office is located at the very centre of Pieksämäki and it is open on weekdays (Mo-Fri) . The letterboxes in Finland are yellow. There is also post service at the Campus of Forestry.

WHAT IS ECTS?

The European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) was developed by the European Commission to facilitate student exchange among universities throughout Europe – and in future, even further. It provides a mechanism to create transparency, to build bridges between institutions and to widen the choices available to students. The system enables the institutions to recognize the learning achievements of students through the use of commonly understood measurements – credits and grades – and it also provides a means to interpret national systems of higher education. Full academic recognition means that the study period abroad (including examinations or other forms of assessment) replaces a comparable period of study at the home institution, though the content of the agreed study programme may differ.

The ECTS system is based on three core elements:

- ▶ **information** – on study programs and student achievements,
- ▶ **mutual agreement** – between the partner institutions and the student,
- ▶ **use of ECTS credits** – the ECTS credits indicate the student workload – 60 credits represent the workload of an academic year.

LLP/Erasmus Program is the way of obtaining mutual agreements between universities and colleges in different countries. The European Commission has decided to include the ECTS in its proposal for the Socrates Program, in particular in Chapter 1 on higher education (Erasmus).

Three key documents:

- ▶ **Information Package**
supplies written information to students and staff on institutions, departments/faculties, organisation and structure of studies and course units
- ▶ **Learning Agreement**
covers the program of study to be taken and the ECTS credits to be awarded for their satisfactory completion
- ▶ **Transcript of Records**
shows students' learning achievements in a way which is comprehensive, commonly understood and easily transferable from one institution to another
